AN ALL-INCLUSIVE TABLE TENNIS COMPETITION AT BRADDEL HEIGHTS COMMUNITY HUB, THE FORMER SERANGOON BUS INTERCHANGE

The **Passion Table Tennis** event this year is a <u>more inclusive event involving 40 community teams including teams from the Table Tennis Association for the Disabled, and it took place on Sunday, 23 November 2014 right in the heartlands of Braddel Heights Community Hub, formerly the Serangoon Bus Interchange. Mr Seah Kian Peng, Deputy Speaker of Parliament and Advisor to Marine Parade GRC Grassroots Organisations said "Braddell Heights grassroots organisations and leaders are honoured and delighted to host the Passion Table Tennis event here. I am a big advocate of sports as a form of strengthening community bonds and this event provides a great platform for residents to come together to watch and play in this friendly competition and at the same time, forge new and renew friendships".</u>

- 2. The People's Association (PA) and Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA) has collaborated since 2011 to form table tennis sports communities, <u>targeting to form 87 Passion Table Tennis Clubs</u>, <u>one in each constituency by 2015</u>. The Clubs bring like-minded residents together to hone their table tennis skills as well as build friendships, and have grown to 69 this year, up from 50 last year, each led by resident peer leaders.
- 3. This event also gave disadvantaged players a family-like feeling and a sense of belonging within the table tennis community by including three teams from the Table Tennis Association for the Disabled.
- 4. Ms Ellen Lee Geck Hoon, PBM, President of STTA attended the event together with four members of the national team: Feng Tian Wei, Isabelle Li, Chen Feng and Clarence Chew. Ms Lee shared "Table Tennis is a popular sport in Singapore that brings people of different background together. I am so touched to see our fellow disabled players playing alongside the able-bodied players and it goes to show how inclusive the sport can be, and I hope this will inspire more Singaporeans to learn and play table tennis as a sport."
- 5. Braddell Heights Community Sports Club (CSC) organised this year's event, which is an annual high point event supported by the PA and STTA. The team competition event was played to a single 7-point game, and on a rotational basis to allow the teams to play with more opponents. Winners are determined by the number of points they score in each rotation instead of the number of wins to encourage the teams to give their best until the final round.
