## 2.0 PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As the newly elected President of the Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA), it brings me immense pleasure to present the annual report for the period of 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023.

As a former athlete and sports enthusiast, I have always been passionate about the power of sports to transform lives. Although I no longer actively participate in competitive sports, I believe that my new role provides me with a unique opportunity to make a positive impact. I am committed to supporting and empowering young players who are currently engaged in competitive sports, and helping them realize their full potential.



The SEA Games and Commonwealth Games saw STTA field a number of young players who gave Team Singapore plenty of reasons to celebrate. At the Hanoi SEA Games, our team won an impressive 2 golds, 3 silvers and 4 bronzes. As a first-time attendee, it was an unforgettable moment when we witnessed our flag being raised and sang Majulah Singapura. Similarly, at the Birmingham Commonwealth Games, half of our team were new debutants who made significant contributions to our medal haul. The team performed exceptionally well, securing three golds, two silvers and two bronzes.

During this fiscal year, as many as seven WTT Youth Contender events were available for our junior and youth athletes to participate in. Our athletes showed exceptional performance and achieved great success at both the WTT Youth Contender Bangkok 2022 and WTT Youth Contender Darwin 2022 tournaments.

At the Southeast Asian Junior and Cadet Table Tennis Championships, our youths finished with 4 golds, 5 silvers and 3 bronzes.

Our strong pipeline of talented athletes is reflected in these results. To continue fostering a new generation of paddlers, we have taken steps to promote more young athletes to the intermediate squad as of January 2023. Additionally, we have appointed Jing Junhong, a three-time Olympian, as the new head coach of the national women's table tennis team. Our goal is to support our high-potential athletes every step of the way. Hence, securing increased funding is critical to provide the necessary resources for our athletes.

In pursuit of this objective, STTA organized a successful Fund Raising Golf & Dinner on 14 October 2022 at Orchid Country Club, raising over \$400,000. These donations were used to enhance the performance of our athletes and strengthen the pipeline for sustained podium success at the highest levels.

We are also pleased to share that our local tournaments resumed in full swing and we have seen a steady increase in participation. Remarkably, we had young athletes as young as five years old participating in the sport. In addition, STTA conducted frequent camps during school holidays, as well as courses for umpiring and coaching to encourage the growth of the sport.



The most significant occurrence in Singapore's table tennis scene was the WTT Singapore Smash 2023, which took place at the OCBC Arena from March 7th to 19th, 2023. One of the highlights of the Grand Smash was a meet-and-greet session between Lee Sangsu (KOR) and Xiang Peng (CHN) and local youth paddlers. The aspiring athletes were even able to practice and exchange shots with the star players.

In addition to that, more than 20 of our young athletes took part in the Singapore Smash Ball Kids' programme, which allowed them to witness the world's top players in action from a close distance. Moreover, our coaches received valuable insights from Coach Liu Yan Jun, who had previously served as the Head Coach of the Austrian Women's team for 24 years. He conducted a coaching workshop on the subject of developing young athletes for our STTA coaches.

As we look ahead, we have a lot to be excited about, with upcoming events such as the SEA Games in Cambodia and the Hangzhou Asian Games, as well as qualifying events for our paddlers to compete in the 2024 Paris Olympics. Additionally, we have a number of WTT Youth Contenders in the works for our young and junior players to take part in.

Furthermore, we are pleased to announce the return of the Singapore Junior & Hopes Invitational Table Tennis Tournament, which has previously drawn competitors from China, South Korea, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Chinese Taipei, Indonesia, and Japan.

With numerous events and competitions on the horizon, I am excited about the prospect of achieving even greater success. I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to our supporters, sponsors, athletes, and their families for their unwavering support. I would also like to express my appreciation to my management committee and staff.

I am deeply grateful to our stakeholders and partners, including the Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth, Sport Singapore, Singapore National Olympic Council, Singapore Sports School, People's Association, Nee Soon South CCMC, Toa Payoh Central CSC, Bedok Reservoir-Punggol CCC, and Toa Payoh SAFRA. Furthermore, I would like to extend special thanks to our media friends for their coverage of STTA's achievements and events.

### 3.0 BACKGROUND OF THE ASSOCIATION

Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA), established in 1965, is the national governing body for table tennis in Singapore.



The Association is a not-for-profit organization registered under the Societies Act, Cap. 311. We were registered as a charity on 1 January 2011, granted IPC status since 1 February 2011 and GST registered on 1 March 2009.

The Association is affiliated to Singapore National Olympic Council (SNOC) and receives subsidies from Sport Singapore. Internationally, STTA is also a member of the International

Table Tennis Federation, Commonwealth Table Tennis Federation Limited, Asian Table Tennis Union and South East Asia Table Tennis Association.

The STTA has its Constitution as its governing instrument.

#### VISION

To make table tennis the most popular sport in Singapore.

#### MISSION

Our mission is to develop world class table tennis players by identifying, nurturing and motivating aspiring table-tennis talents to become the best that they could be. The STTA is also committed to promoting table tennis vigorously by building a significant number of table tennis players to help make a vibrant sporting Singapore.

The objectives of the STTA:

- (a) To increase participation and promote community engagement and bonding through the sport of table tennis, in order to promote health and wellness, inclusiveness and integration, and inspire the Singapore Spirit.
- (b) To promote and safeguard the sport of table tennis, and employ when necessary, the funds of STTA for the said purpose.
- (c) (c) To uphold the rules and regulations (with such alterations and amendments as may be made from time to time) of the sport of table tennis as adopted by the International Table Tennis Federation (hereinafter known as "ITTF") and to notify all members in writing of the same.

- (d) To control, conduct or supervise any table tennis tournament in the Republic of Singapore (as may be necessary).
- (e) To select players to represent the Republic of Singapore in local and overseas table tennis tournaments or matches.
- (f) To arrange friendly or competitive table tennis matches with other countries, local or overseas clubs or associations.
- (g) To settle any dispute that may arise between members of STTA and to clarify any doubt in relation to the rules and regulations of the sport of table tennis (with such alterations and amendments as may be made from time to time) as adopted by the ITTF.
- (h) To obtain, collect and receive money and funds by way of contributions, donations, subscriptions, legacies, grants or any other lawful means for or towards the objects of STTA.

#### HIGHLIGHT OF ATHLETES' PERFORMANCES

##### Mixed Doubles

There were 13 pairs of mixed doubles which 2 pairs were from Singapore. Due to Lin Ye's injury and withdrawal, Koen Pang and Wong Xin Ru could only start training one week before the games. The new pair had to face off the top seed from Thailand (Padasak Tanviriyavechakul and Suthasini Sawettabut). The Thai duo had been doubles partners for many years and were higher ranked than both Koen and Xin Ru, the chances of making it to the finals were slim. However, Koen and Xin Ru played a fantastic match against the Thai with a 3-0 (11-9, 11-8, 13-11) to meet teammates Clarence and Zeng Jian in an all-Singaporean final. Koen and Xin Ru emerged as the new crown champions which meant that they successfully won over the top 2 seed pairs.

## Men's Doubles

Intense was the word while watching Clarence Chew and Ethan Poh against Malaysia pair (Choong Javen and Wang Qi Shen). Clarence who suffered a shoulder injury was unable to use much strength to deliver forehand attacks but persevered and made it to the finals with his partner Ethan. Hoping for another all-Singaporean final, our second men's doubles pair Josh and Koen, however, failed to hold steady when it came to the final set and Singapore was leading 9-4 against the Philippines choppers (Richard G and John Russel). The opponents kept being awarded points due to Koen and Josh's mistakes which

affected their morale and had to settle for joint bronze. Being debutants at the games, there were much uncertainties given the short period of time training together and it was also their debut major game. #### **4.7 Hopes Squad Follow-up Activity, Singapore: 9-15 Mar 2023**

The Hopes Squad follow-up activity was held in Singapore together with Singapore Grand Smash, where 25 young players from all over the world came together to participate in an intensive training camp from 9 to 15 March 2023.

The Hopes squad training camp in Singapore included some of the most promising young talents in the world of table tennis, including Kulapassr Vijitviriyagul from Thailand and Danilo Faso from Italy, the winners of the 2022 ITTF World Hopes Week & Challenge. This was the first follow-up activity, and upon the completion of all follow-up activities, the ITTF High Performance would select 4 girls and 4 boys for the Hopes Team, offering them additional opportunities to progress along the Hopes pathway.



They were joined by 13 experienced coaches, including ITTF High Performance Elite Coach Massimo Costantini and Head Coaches Eva Jeler (AUS) and Liu Yanjun (AUT).

This Hopes Squad follow-up activity provided a comprehensive experience for the players, focusing not only on their athletic skills but also on their personal and educational development.

The training camp lasted for seven days which gave the players plenty of time to hone their skills and learn from the coaches. One of the most exciting aspects of the camp was that the players got to train at the state-of-the-art facilities of OCBC Arena, where they experienced what it was like to train like their idols and witnessed them in action at the Singapore Smash 2023. The Hopes squad walked out onto the court as mascots for the players during the event, making it a week that were both unforgettable and inspiring for these young players.

## 5.0 SPORTS DEVELOPMENT

### 5.1 Learn-To-Play (Basic) and Continue-To-Play (Intermediate) Programmes

The Learn to Play (LTP) Programme was developed targeting members of public (aged 5 & above) who wished to acquire basic skills in Table Tennis. At LTP, trainees learn the fundamental rules and techniques of playing the game. After completing the LTP Programme, trainees who wish to further develop their skills could go on to the Continue-To-Play (CTP) Programme.

There were three training venues currently available for the LTP lessons. The three training venues were located at Clementi Sports Hall, Bedok

Punggol (Hougang) Zone Training Center (ZTC), and Yishun ZTC. All LTP participants were encouraged to pursue further in Table Tennis by taking part in the CTP programme after completion of the 10-lesson LTP class.

The LTP and CTP programmes were completely suspended from FY2020 to FY2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. However, with the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions in end March 2022, STTA was able to resume the LTP and CTP programmes. STTA had since organized a total of 12 classes attracting over 200 participants in FY2022.

### 5.2 Zone Training Centres

The main objective of the Zone Training programmes was to promote and develop local talents. The top talents, identified through selection trials, were invited to join the Junior Development Squad as part of the pathway development designed by STTA.

With the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions in end March 2022, STTA was able to resume full group training for our ZTC programmes and accepted new registrations.



As at 31 March 2023, the ZTC programme had a total of 345 players with an average of 49 players from each centre. The players' age mainly ranged from 5 years old to 11 years old with some following through with the programme until 13 years old. With the resumption of the annual tournaments organised/jointly organised by STTA, the coaches arranged for the players to participate in the competitions. Our trainees from the programme continued to dominate the 9 & Under category, with majority of the players from round of 16 onwards from the programme. The programme also continued

to successfully feed players into the Junior Development Squad for further training and development.

### 5.3 Coaching Accreditation and Development System

STTA organised the third run of the SG-Coach Level 1 (Full Integration) Table Tennis Coaching Course from 19 March 2023 to 9 April 2023 which incorporated the E-Learning modules on the SportSG-ED platform by CoachSG. The theory tests for the Foundation Sports Science and Coaching Theory were also administered online via the SportSG-ED platform. A total of 17 participants attended the course.

In conjunction with the WTT Smash Singapore (held from 7 to 19 March 2023) in Singapore, a coaching workshop was conducted, with world-renowned coaches, Massimo Costantini (ITTF High Performance Elite Coach) and Liu Yan Jun (Austrian Women's National Team Coach), sharing their knowledge and experience with our developmental coaches. A total of 30 coaches attended the workshop.

### 5.4 Sports Development

#### 5.4.1 Table Tennis School Holiday Camp

The Table Tennis School Holiday Camp aimed to promote the sport of table tennis by introducing the basics of the sport to the students over 2 half-days training camp. Students who were interested in developing their skills further would then be referred to register with our ZTC or LTP/CTP programmes.

Since the pandemic, we had seen increased interest among parents in sending their children for camps during school holiday due to travel restrictions. In response to the increase in demand, STTA organised a total of 7 Table Tennis School Holiday Camps in FY2022 with 2 of them happening during the May-June school holiday, 2 during September school holiday, 2 during the year end school holiday and 1 during March school holiday. The Holiday Camps attracted a

## 6.2 National Ranking System

Since the launch of the STTA National Ranking System on 20 January 2013, we had captured the rankings of more than 1000 players who took part in the series of tournaments organised / co-organised by STTA over the years.

By using the tournament software, we were able to assign ranking points to each of the players for the various competitions and publish them online, which facilitated the participants and parents in tracking the players' ranking. The resumption of our local competitions after the pandemic had seen the ranking system revived after the 2 years of lulled period.



## 7.0 OFFICIATING

### 7.1 Umpires / Referees

As activities gradually returned to normal after the COVID-19 pandemic, STTA was able to organise many technical officials' development initiatives in FY2022. We managed to register 8 local umpires for the International Umpires Examination held on 24 September 2022. 6 of them passed the examination and attained the white badge to officially qualify as international umpires.

STTA also collaborated with the International Table Tennis Federation Umpires and Referees Committee to organise an International Referee Course (IR School) here in Singapore from 18 to 21 November 2022. A total of 12 international umpires from different countries (including 2 from Singapore) attended the course. Both of our Singapore candidates passed the course to officially join our pool of international referees.

In addition, STTA organised the National Umpire course from 13 to 27 February to increase our pool of local umpires. A total of 22 participants registered and attended the course. 20 of them passed the theory examination and would officially be certified as national umpires upon completing the practical evaluation within one year.

Many useful information and updates on new developments were shared at the Umpires and Referees' Seminar held on 26 March 2023.

With the resumption of many international competitions in FY2022, STTA took the opportunity to send our international umpires for overseas officiating assignments including some major competitions like the Southeast Asian Games, Commonwealth Games and ASEAN Para Games, which were good exposure for some.

As of 31 March 2023, STTA had a total of 374 national umpires, 46 international umpires and 8 international referees who were active.

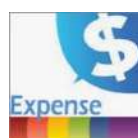
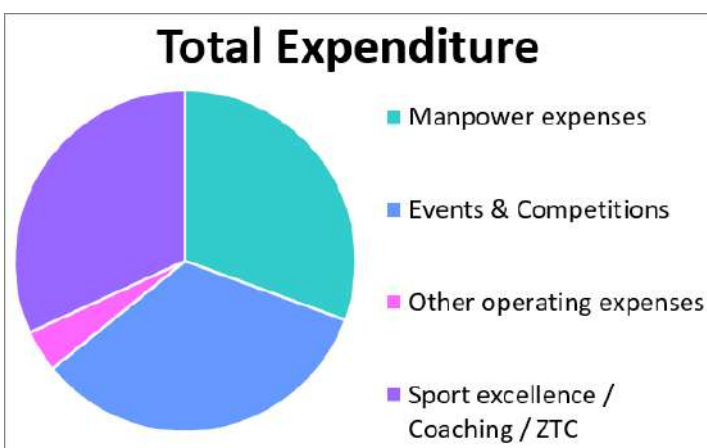
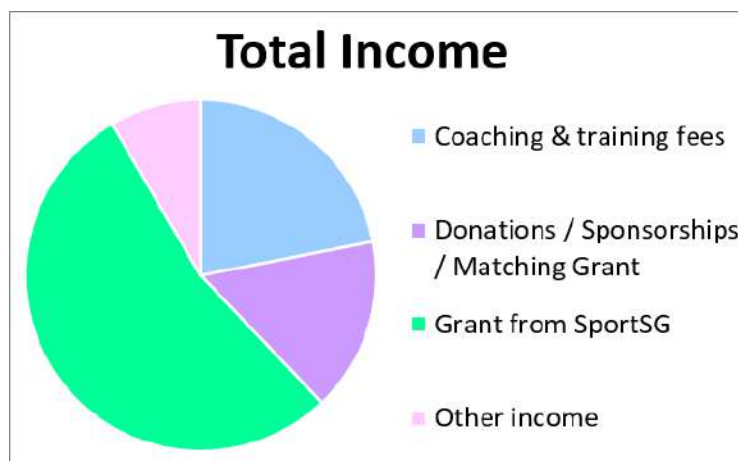

## 20.0 FUTURE PLANS AND COMMITMENTS

### 20.1 High Performance

SEA Games is slated to take place in May 2023, this will be followed by World Championships Finals in Durban, South Africa. In September 2023, there will be Asian Championships followed by Asian Games in Hangzhou.

Besides these major games, there will also be continental and world qualification events for Paris Olympic Games team event in 2023. World Team Championships in February 2024 has been designated as the world team qualification event which will offer 8 slots for the team event.

As part of preparations for the major games and qualification events, there will be a series of overseas training camps in FY2023. Sparring partners with various playing styles will be invited to the training camps to train with our national team.

## 20.2 Sports Development

### a) Coaching Development

STTA is committed to support the development of Table Tennis Coaches in Singapore. The technical accreditation policy put in place in end of February 2019 will continue to provide an avenue for experienced table tennis coaches in obtaining technical certification. With the completion of the development of the SG Coach (Full Integration) Table Tennis Level 1 Coaching Course syllabus, STTA continues to develop the full integration level 2 coaching course syllabus. STTA will also continue to organise Coaching Workshops as well as Continuing Coach Education (CCE) courses for the table tennis coaches to upgrade themselves. Coaching attachments and mentorships programmes will also be arranged for sharing of experience and knowledge transfer.

### b) Technical and Officiating Development

STTA will continue to work on developing our local technical officials. Development and progression pathways for umpires and referees are in place with opportunities provided for aspiring local officials to progress onto the international stage. The Umpires and Referees' Committee will also be introducing the umpires' evaluation and assessment system to help improve the standards of our local officials and prepare them for progression to the international stage.
