1.0 SINGAPORE TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION (STTA) MANAGEMENT TEAM



The Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA) is governed by its Management Committee, which is headed by the President, and serves as the governing body responsible for overseeing the strategic direction, governance, and overall management of the Association.



Supporting the Management Committee are various Sub-Committees, each tasked with overseeing specific functional areas such as High Performance, Local Tournaments, Human Resources and Finance, among others. These Sub-Committees provide focused expertise and recommendations to guide the Association's policies and programmes.

Importantly, none of the members of the Management Committee receive any remuneration for their services to STTA, reflecting their commitment to the sport and the Association's mission.

At the operational level, the Association is led by a Chief Executive Officer (CEO), who is responsible for the day-to-day management and implementation of STTA's programmes and initiatives. The CEO reports directly to the Management Committee, ensuring alignment between strategic objectives and operational execution.

Under the current constitution, an individual may serve as a member of the Management Committee for no more than four consecutive terms, with each term being two years in duration, amounting to a maximum of eight consecutive years. After completing this period, the individual is required to take a break of at least one full term, or two years, before being eligible for re-election to the Committee.

Similarly, the position of Honorary Treasurer is subject to its own term limits. An individual may hold the office of Honorary Treasurer for a maximum of two consecutive terms, or four years in total. Following this, the individual must step down from the role and may only be re-elected to the same office after a break of at least one full term of two years.

It is important to note that several members of the Management Committee had served for more than eight consecutive years, but their service occurred entirely under the provisions of the previous constitution. These individuals were in compliance with the governing rules in effect at the time.

1.19 EXECUTIVE MANAGEMENT



Wong Hui Leng
Chief Executive Officer of STTA

Appointed on 1 August 2009, Wong Hui Leng has been serving as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the STTA, providing strategic leadership and overseeing the implementation of high-performance programmes, development initiatives, and operational management of the Association.

2.0 PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



2024 can be considered as a year of harvest of our first crops. We are indeed grateful that our decade-long efforts to nurture local talents are bearing fruits.

For the first time in STTA's history, two local born players, Izaak Quek and Zhou Jingyi, qualified for the Olympic Games 2024 in Paris and became the youngest ever Singaporean-born paddlers to qualify for the epitome of sporting excellence. Zeng Jian also qualified for the first time for the Olympics.

In October 2024, Izaak and Koen Pang ended Singapore's 11-year medal drought in Men's Doubles after clinching silver at the 27th ITTF-Asian Table Tennis Championships. The duo became the first local-born players to win a medal at the event.

Shortly after, in November 2024, our women's table tennis team of Zeng Jian, Ser Lin Qian, Loy Ming Ying, Tan Zhao Yun and Zhang Wanling reclaimed the Women's Team Champion title after missing out for a decade, at the SEA Championships 2024 in November. Zhang was also part of the team that won in 2014.

Our youth and junior athletes also excelled on the international stage, in particular, Lin Qian and Ming Ying. Ming Ying won three Girls U15 Singles titles at WTT Youth Contenders Bangkok, Antalya and San Francisco. She also won a joint-bronze in the Girls U15 Singles at the Asian Youth Table Tennis Championships 2024, while Lin Qian partnered Zhao Yun to win joint-bronze in the Girls U19 Doubles at the same competition.

There were also strong performances at the WTT Youth Contender Vientiane 2024, where Neo Cheng Ming and Tan Ruixiang secured second and third place respectively in the Boys' U11 Singles. At the WTT Youth Contender Darwin 2024, Janelle Chiang finished third in both the U15 and U17 Girls' Singles events. To round up the year, our juniors achieved an outstanding haul of four golds, three silvers, and seven bronzes at the SEA Youth Table Tennis Championships held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

I am heartened and very proud of our athletes and coaches. They have worked extremely hard, picked themselves up from earlier setbacks and eventually rose to the occasion at these important competitions. Their achievements are commendable and are an inspiration for their juniors who aspire to shine as a professional athlete.

Looking ahead, our national teams are intensifying their preparations for the SEA Games 2025 in Bangkok, Thailand, this December, approaching the competition with renewed energy and focus. Our players are determined to make a strong impact on the regional stage once again. Meanwhile, on the home front, the Singapore Invitational Junior & Hopes Table Tennis Tournament will return in June 2025 and we eagerly anticipate participants from China, Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Chinese Taipei, and Indonesia.

On the community front, I am delighted to share that our local tournaments, such as the Crocodile Challenge Cup, have continued to grow from strength to strength. 3.0 BACKGROUND OF THE ASSOCIATION

The Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA), established in 1965, is the national governing body for table tennis in Singapore. The Association is a not-for-profit organisation registered under the Societies Act, Cap. 311.

STTA was registered as a charity on 1 January 2011, granted Institution of a Public Character (IPC) status since 1 February 2011, and has been GST-registered since 1 March 2009.



STTA is affiliated with the Singapore National Olympic Council (SNOC) and receives subsidies from Sport Singapore in support of its programmes and athlete development initiatives.

At the international level, STTA is a member of several key governing bodies, including:

- International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF)
- Commonwealth Table Tennis Federation Limited
- Asian Table Tennis Union (ATTU)
- South East Asia Table Tennis Association (SEATTA)

The Association is governed by its Constitution, which provides the legal and operational framework for its activities and ensures accountability and good governance.

VISION

To make table tennis the most popular sport in Singapore.

MISSION

Our mission is to develop world class table tennis players by identifying, nurturing and motivating aspiring table-tennis talents to become the best that they could be. The STTA is also committed to promoting table tennis vigorously by building a significant number of table tennis players to help make a vibrant sporting Singapore.

The objectives of the STTA:

- (a) To increase participation and promote community engagement and bonding through the sport of table tennis, in order to promote health and wellness, inclusiveness and integration, and inspire the Singapore Spirit.
- (b) To promote and safeguard the sport of table tennis, and employ, when necessary, the funds of STTA for the said purpose.

- (c) To uphold the rules and regulations (with such alterations and amendments as may be made from time to time) of the sport of table tennis as adopted by the International Table Tennis Federation (hereinafter known as “ITTF”) and to notify all members in writing of the same.
- (d) To control, conduct or supervise any table tennis tournament in the Republic of Singapore (as may be necessary).
- (e) To select players to represent the Republic of Singapore in local and overseas table tennis tournaments or matches.
- (f) To arrange friendly or competitive table tennis matches with other countries, local or overseas clubs or associations.
- (g) To settle any dispute that may arise between members of STTA and to clarify any doubt in relation to the rules and regulations of the sport of table tennis (with such alterations and amendments as may be made from time to time) as adopted by the ITTF.
- (h) To obtain, collect and receive money and funds by way of contributions, donations, subscriptions, legacies, grants or any other lawful means for or towards the objects of STTA.

In the sixth game, Darko went on the aggressive mode and Izaak made a few unforced errors. Izaak eventually lost 2-4 to Darko to end his Olympic campaign.

Zeng Jian started the match well and won the first game 11-9. In the second game, Zeng Jian could not sustain the lead at 10-8. The second game fightback gave a lot of confidence to Akula; Zeng Jian had no answers to her forehand attacks in the third and fourth game. In the fifth game, Zeng Jian fought back to make the score 2-3. In the sixth game, Zeng Jian saved 3 match points to level the score at 10-10 but Akula was more aggressive in the last 2 points to close out the match.

5.0 SPORTS DEVELOPMENT

5.1 Learn-To-Play (Basic) and Continue-To-Play (Intermediate) Programmes

The Learn to Play (LTP) Programme was developed to introduce members of the public aged 5 and above to the sport of table tennis. Designed for beginners, the programme teaches participants the fundamental rules and basic techniques of the game in a structured and engaging environment.

Upon completion of the 10-lesson LTP programme, participants are encouraged to continue their development through the Continue-To-Play (CTP) Programme, which offers a more advanced level of training for those who wish to further refine their skills.

As of FY2024, the LTP Programme is conducted at six training centres across Singapore:

- Clementi
- Hougang
- Yishun
- Bishan
- Kallang
- Pasir Ris

In FY2024, STTA successfully organised 30 LTP classes, attracting over 261 participants, reflecting strong community interest and growing participation in the sport.

5.2 Zone Training Centres

The main objective of the Zone Training Centres (ZTC) Programme is to promote and develop local table tennis talent at a young age. Designed as an integral part of STTA's talent pipeline, the programme identifies top-performing players through selection trials and offers them the opportunity to progress into the Junior Development Squad (JDS)—a key step in STTA's structured pathway development framework.

As of 31 Mar 2025, the ZTC Programme had a total of 312 players, with an average of 52 players per centre. The majority of participants were between 5 and 11 years old, with some continuing in the programme up to the age of 13.

To foster a competitive spirit and ensure that all players experience the excitement of tournament play, coaches regularly invite trainees to participate in annual competitions organised or co-organised by STTA. This exposure helps players gain valuable match experience while reinforcing their training.

Notably, trainees from the ZTC Programme have shown exceptional results, particularly in the 9 & Under category, where a majority of players from the Round of 16 onwards are trainees of the programme. The ZTC Programme continues to be a vital feeder into the Junior Development Squad, playing a critical role in nurturing Singapore's future table tennis champions.

5.3 Coaching Accreditation and Development System

STTA successfully organised the fifth run of the SG-Coach Level 1 (Full Integration) Table Tennis Coaching Course from 14 to 26 Nov 2024. This course incorporated E-Learning modules hosted on the

SportSG-ED platform by CoachSG, ensuring a blended and flexible learning experience for aspiring coaches. In addition, the theory assessments for Foundation Sports Science and Coaching Theory were conducted at Republic Polytechnic. A total of 22 participants attended and completed the course.

To further support the professional growth of certified coaches, STTA also conducted two Continuing Coach Education (CCE) Workshops on 30 Apr 2024 and 21 Oct 2024, which drew a combined total of 75 participants. These workshops aimed to keep coaches updated on the latest methodologies and best practices in coaching.



In conjunction with the WTT Smash Singapore, STTA also hosted a special coaching seminar featuring world-renowned Chinese national coach Li Dacheng. Coach Li shared valuable insights and experiences with our developmental coaches, providing a rare opportunity for local coaches to learn from one of the sport's leading minds. The seminar was well received, with 29 coaches in attendance.



5.4 Sports Development

5.4.1 Table Tennis School Holiday Camp

The Table Tennis School Holiday Camp, an outreach initiative by the STTA aimed at promoting the sport among young students. Conducted over two half-day sessions, the camp introduces participants to the basic skills and fundamentals of table tennis in a fun and engaging environment. Students who show interest and aptitude are subsequently encouraged to further their development by joining STTA's Zone Training Centres (ZTC) or Learn-to-Play (LTP) / Continue-to-Play (CTP) programmes.

In FY2024, STTA successfully organised a total of six School Holiday Camps:

- 2 camps during the June school holidays
- 1 camp during the September school holidays
- 2 camps during the year-end holidays
- 1 camp during the March 2025 holidays

These camps attracted a total of 117 students, with participants aged between 5 and 12 years old. The positive response highlighted growing interest in the sport and underscores the camp's value as an effective engagement platform.



6.0 LOCAL TOURNAMENTS

6.1 Locally Organised Tournaments

In FY2024, STTA continued to organise, as well as to engage partners in co-organising numerous local competitions to create a vibrant competition calendar catering to various groups of players. Other than the usual ranked tournaments where local players were able to accumulate their national ranking points through the various competitions to compete for qualification in the Char Yong National Youth Top 10 Table Tennis Tournament, STTA also included team competitions and community challenge to include greater participation. 7.0 OFFICIATING

7.1 Umpires / Referees

In FY2024, STTA continued to strengthen the capabilities of its technical officials through a series of structured development initiatives and training programmes.

STTA organised two runs of the National Umpire Course:

- 2 to 18 Oct 2024
- 17 Feb to 4 Mar 2025

A total of 48 participants registered and attended the courses, contributing to the continued renewal and growth of our officiating base.

Separately, a Referees' Seminar was held on 30 Nov 2024 to provide important updates, learning points, and reinforce standards and expectations among Singapore's referees.

The Umpires' Seminar, held on 16 Feb 2025, saw the participation of over 40 umpires. The seminar included:

- A presentation on completed projects in FY2024
- Latest updates on officiating guidelines and international best practices
- A knowledge quiz to reinforce learning, with prizes awarded to top scorers

STTA also provided international exposure opportunities by sending qualified referees and umpires to officiate at major overseas events, including:

- The Paralympic Games
- ITTF World Cup
- WTT Finals

Locally, STTA's international umpires played key officiating roles in prestigious events such as the WTT Singapore Smash and the Youth Star Contender, held at the OCBC Arena from 30 Jan to 9 Feb 2025.

8.0 EVENTS

8.1 STTA Olympics Press Conference



The Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA) proudly announced its final lineup for the national table tennis team competing in the Paris 2024 Olympic Games during a press conference held on 19 Jun 2024 at the OCBC Arena of Singapore Sports Hub.

STTA President, Ms Poh Li San, introduced the athletes who would be representing Singapore in table tennis at the Tokyo 2024 Olympics – Zeng Jian

(27) and Izaak Quek (18), with Zhou Jingyi (19) joining the press conference online from Portugal.

During the press conference, Ms Poh proudly highlighted several historic milestones achieved by Singapore's table tennis athletes ahead of the upcoming Olympic Games:

- Izaak Quek became the youngest ever Singaporean male table tennis player, as well as the youngest Singapore-born male player, to qualify for the Olympics.
- Zhou Jingyi made history as the youngest Singapore-born female player to qualify for the Olympics, and also as the first Singapore-born female to compete in the Singles Events at the Games.
- For the first time in history, two Singapore-born players have qualified for the same edition of the Olympic Games, marking a significant milestone in the nation's table tennis journey.

These achievements are a testament to STTA's long-term commitment to local talent development and the success of its athlete pathway programmes.

At the press conference, the players proudly unveiled the official jersey that will be worn at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. The jersey was proudly sponsored by DONIC and featured a unique design by Raeanne Koh, a talented student from the Art Elective Programme (AEP) at Hwa Chong Institution.

This year, STTA partnered with Hwa Chong Institution's AEP to foster youth creativity and national pride through design. As part of this collaboration, eight students submitted

13.0 CHARITY STATUS

STTA had been registered as a charity under the Charities Act since 1 January 2011. Following its registration, income received by the Association is exempted from tax, in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act applicable to registered charities.

14.0 GST REGISTRATION

STTA had been registered for Goods and Services Tax (GST) since 1 March 2000. As a GST-registered entity, STTA is required to comply with GST regulations, including charging GST on taxable supplies and filing periodic GST returns to the Inland Revenue Authority of Singapore (IRAS).

15.0 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS & RESERVES

STTA had established a reserves policy to ensure the long-term financial stability of its operations and to maintain sufficient resources in the event of unforeseen circumstances.

The Association aims to maintain reserves equivalent to at least one year of operational expenditure. This reserve level is reviewed annually by the Management Committee to ensure it remains adequate to meet the Association's ongoing obligations and to support its mission sustainably.

19.0 STTA BOARD REVIEW

STTA conducted its Board review through a Pulse Workshop on 9 April 2024 at the ActiveSG Room, located at 3 Stadium Drive, Singapore 397630, with the objectives to:

1. Review and discuss the findings from the Board Pulse Report, including key strengths and areas for improvement identified by both Board and Non-Board members.
2. Reflect on the Board's success in promoting table tennis as a popular sport in Singapore, and identify actions to further improve its effectiveness.
3. Identify key focus areas to enhance member engagement and support the development and growth of table tennis, including finance and capital development, talent development, and talent retention.
4. Propose actionable strategies to address the identified priorities, with follow-up discussions planned for future Board meetings.

The workshop was attended by 12 Management Committee (MC) Members and 7 Secretariat staff, and was facilitated pro bono by the Centre for Non-Profit Leadership and its appointed Consultant, to whom STTA extends its sincere gratitude.



20.0 REVIEW OF THE FINANCIAL STATE

20.1 Summary of Financial Performance

For the financial year ended 31 Mar 2025, STTA recorded a net surplus of \$602k under unrestricted funds and \$462k under restricted funds. The Association had no outstanding loans as at 31 Mar 2025.



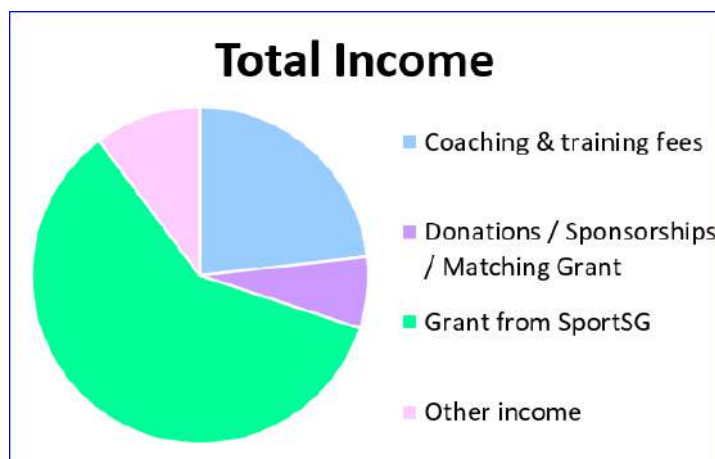

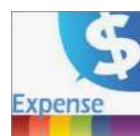
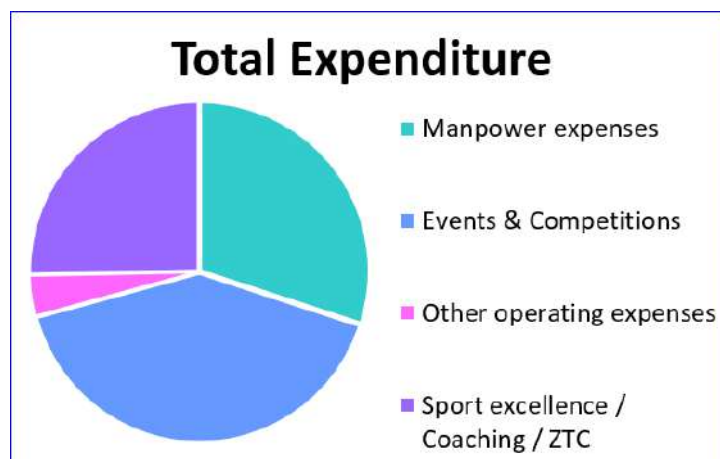
Donations received: \$494k, of which \$485k were ring-fenced in the Restricted Funds as One Team Singapore Fund.

21.0 FUTURE PLANS AND COMMITMENTS

21.1 High Performance

With the conclusion of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, the 2028 Los Angeles (LA) Olympic cycle has officially begun. The introduction of the Men's Doubles and Women's Doubles events in the 2028 Olympics has brought renewed motivation to the team. Following a review of the Paris Games and STTA's high-performance strategies, the high-performance team, including coaches and athletes, has already begun preparations toward qualification for LA 2028.

In 2025, the Southeast Asian (SEA) Games, to be held in Thailand, stand out as one of the most important competitions in the calendar. Additionally, the Asian Youth Games will serve as a key test event ahead of the 2026 Youth Olympic Games. Other major events include the World Table Tennis Championships and the Asian Team Championships—the latter serving as a qualifier for the 2026 Asian Games.



Although the SEA Games is the only major multi-sport event in 2025, the World Table Tennis (WTT) calendar remains packed, featuring a full slate of competitions including:

- WTT Smashes
- WTT Championships
- WTT Contender Series
- WTT Feeder Series

Beyond international tournaments, foreign leagues and sparring opportunities are viewed as critical success factors for the new Olympic cycle. In FY2025, STTA will continue to actively pursue partnerships with clubs and national associations to secure overseas training stints and foreign league exposure for our athletes, enhancing their competitiveness on the global stage.

21.2 Sports Development

a) Coaching Development

STTA remains committed to supporting the development of table tennis coaches in Singapore. Since the implementation of the Technical Accreditation Policy in Feb 2019, experienced coaches have had a clear pathway to obtain technical certification, and this framework will continue to be strengthened. STTA is dedicated to conducting the Full Integration Level 1 Coaching Course and is actively working on the development of the Level 2 Coaching Course syllabus. These initiatives aim to raise coaching standards and ensure alignment with international best practices.

In addition, STTA will continue to organise:

- Coaching Workshops
- Continuing Coach Education (CCE) courses

These programmes are designed to provide opportunities for coaches to upgrade their skills and knowledge regularly.

To further support professional growth, coaching attachments and mentorship programmes will also be arranged, facilitating the sharing of experience and knowledge transfer between local and international coaching communities.

b) Technical and Officiating Development

STTA will continue to prioritise the development of local technical officials, recognising their critical role in upholding the integrity and professionalism of the sport.

The development and progression pathways for umpires and referees have been updated to align with International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) standards, ensuring our local officials are well-prepared to meet global expectations. STTA is committed to providing opportunities for aspiring officials to progress onto the international stage, through exposure, training, and practical officiating experiences.

To further strengthen this effort, the Umpires and Referees Committee will be implementing a structured umpires' evaluation and assessment system. This initiative aims to enhance the competency and consistency of local technical officials while preparing them for higher-level appointments and international certifications.

c) Local Tournaments and Events

STTA is committed to vigorously promoting table tennis by nurturing and growing a strong base of players, contributing to a vibrant sporting culture in Singapore. As part of this ongoing effort, STTA has lined up the following local tournaments and events for FY2025 to engage the community, develop talent, and raise the profile of the sport:

STTA also welcomes donations through our official Giving.sg page. Together with all donors, supporters and sponsors, we rally behind Team Singapore and build a strong foundation for continuous success.
