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1.0 SINGAPORE TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION (STTA) MANAGEMENT TEAM

The Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA) is governed by its Management Committee, which is headed by the President, and serves as the governing body responsible for overseeing the strategic direction, governance, and overall management of the Association.

Supporting the Management Committee are various Sub-Committees, each tasked with overseeing specific functional areas such as High Performance, Local Tournaments, Human Resources and Finance, among others. These Sub-Committees provide focused expertise and recommendations to guide the Association's policies and programmes.

Importantly, none of the members of the Management Committee receive any remuneration for their services to STTA, reflecting their commitment to the sport and the Association's mission.

At the operational level, the Association is led by a Chief Executive Officer (CEO), who is responsible for the day-to-day management and implementation of STTA's programmes and initiatives. The CEO reports directly to the Management Committee, ensuring alignment between strategic objectives and operational execution.

Under the current constitution, an individual may serve as a member of the Management Committee for no more than four consecutive terms, with each term being two years in duration, amounting to a maximum of eight consecutive years. After completing this period, the individual is required to take a break of at least one full term, or two years, before being eligible for re-election to the Committee.

Similarly, the position of Honorary Treasurer is subject to its own term limits. An individual may hold the office of Honorary Treasurer for a maximum of two consecutive terms, or four years in total. Following this, the individual must step down from the role and may only be re-elected to the same office after a break of at least one full term of two years.

It is important to note that several members of the Management Committee had served for more than eight consecutive years, but their service occurred entirely under the provisions of the previous constitution. These individuals were in compliance with the governing rules in effect at the time.

2.0 PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The past year has been one of continued progress and consolidation for Singapore table tennis. Building on the strong foundations laid over the past decade, we are now witnessing sustained success across multiple levels of our high-performance and development pathways.

In 2025, Singapore table tennis continued to make steady progress on the regional and international stage, with our athletes delivering consistent and measurable results across multiple competitions.

At the Southeast Asian level, our senior national team emerged from the SEA Games 2025 in Bangkok with **4 Golds, 1 Silver, 2 bronzes**, headlined by Izaak Quek's historic second consecutive "treble" (Men's Team, Doubles, and Singles) and Koen Pang's impressive "double doubles" (Men's and Mixed Doubles).

Our junior contingent also produced an impressive medal haul at the SEA Youth Table Tennis Championships in Indonesia, securing **3 golds, 4 silvers and 5 bronzes**. This strong showing underscores the depth of our youth development system and reinforces Singapore's position as a leading nation in the region for nurturing young talent.

At Asian level, our women's team of Zeng Jian, Ser Lin Qian, Loy Ming Ying, Tan Zhao Yun and Chloe Lai returned to the podium after a four-year absence when they clinched a joint-bronze at the 28th ITTF-ATTU Asian Table Tennis Team Championships.

Our Singapore U15 Girls Team, comprising Loy Ming Ying, Janelle Chiang, Chong Zi Sian and Ng Jing Xuan, clinched a joint-bronze at the Asian Youth Table Tennis Championships in June 2025. On the international circuit, our senior and youth athletes continued to excel at WTT and WTT Youth events.

Izaak and Koen clinched their first ever WTT Star Contender podium finish at the WTT Star Contender Muscat in November 2025 when they finished runners-up.

Loy Ming Ying built on her strong form with multiple podium finishes across the U15 and U17 categories, while Ser Lin Qian also achieved consistent results in both singles and doubles events. In addition, several emerging players, namely, Chevelle See, Arissa Cheng, Gu Xintian, Zane Ong, Isaiah Loh and Benaiah Seah, registered podium finishes in age-group categories, reflecting the growing strength of our development pipeline.

I am deeply proud of our athletes and coaches, whose discipline, resilience and commitment to excellence have driven these achievements. Their ability to consistently perform, adapt and improve is a testament to the strong foundation we are building for the future of Singapore table tennis.

Looking ahead, 2026 presents fresh opportunities and challenges, such as the Asian Games this September. I am sure our athletes will once again rise to the occasion and fly our flag proudly in Japan. In 2025, we saw steady increase in participation rates in our domestic competitions such as the Dr Ng Eng Hen Cup (720 in 2024, 744 in 2025) and Dr Lee Bee Wah Cup, which received 758 entries in 2025 as compared to 755 in 2024.

Our marquee event for primary schools, the **Crocodile Challenge Cup**, drew **nearly 400 participants from 91 schools** — a record number that reflects how well our sport is resonating with the next generation.

STTA's annual invitational competition, the Singapore Junior and Hopes Invitational, attracted 277 participants from 7 countries - **Singapore, China, Chinese Taipei, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Australia** coming together to showcase their skills, passion, and sportsmanship in June. In addition to our sporting milestones, 2025 was also significant in strengthening our community and support base. Our STTA Golf Fundraising and Dinner in July brought together partners, sponsors and supporters from across different sectors in a meaningful way. It was heartening to see the strong turnout and generosity, which will go a long way in supporting our athletes' development, enhancing our programmes, and ensuring that we continue to provide opportunities for the next generation of paddlers to excel.

None of this would be possible without the unwavering support of our partners – Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth, Sport Singapore, Singapore National Olympic Council, International Table Tennis Federation and World Table Tennis, Singapore Sports School and the different Community Sports Networks – Toa Payoh Central, Toa Payoh West, Nee Soon South, just to name a few.

I would also like to extend my heartfelt appreciation to our sponsors and donors — Crocodile Foundation, Neo Garden, 100Plus, STIGA, Char Yong (Dabu) Association, Dato' Sri Prof. Dr Tahir, Mr Mathew Lim Khian Hao, Quantedge Foundation (Singapore) Ltd and My Workfloww. Their continued support has been instrumental in enabling our programmes and uplifting our athletes.

I also wish to acknowledge the dedication and professionalism of our coaches and technical officials. They do not only shaped capable athletes but also mould individuals of strong character. Finally, I would like to encourage our players to remain disciplined, humble and resilient, their fighting spirit will continue to inspire the nation.

As we look ahead, we remain steadfast in our vision — to establish table tennis as a sport of choice in Singapore, to nurture future champions, and to build a united and vibrant sporting community.

3.0 BACKGROUND OF THE ASSOCIATION

The Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA), established in 1965, is the national governing body for table tennis in Singapore. The Association is a not-for-profit organisation registered under the Societies Act, Cap. 311.

STTA was registered as a charity on 1 January 2011, granted Institution of a Public Character (IPC) status since 1 February 2011, and has been GST-registered since 1 March 2009.



STTA is affiliated with the Singapore National Olympic Council (SNOC) and receives subsidies from Sport Singapore in support of its programmes and athlete development initiatives.

At the international level, STTA is a member of several key governing bodies, including:

- International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF)

At the 2025 SEA Games in Thailand, the Singapore table tennis team delivered a dominant performance, finishing with 4 golds, 1 silver, and 2 bronzes. The squad topped the sport's medal standings, headlined by Izaak Quek, who secured a historic second consecutive "treble" by winning gold in the Men's Singles, Men's Doubles, and Men's Team events.



Izaak Quek reaffirmed his status as Southeast Asia's top male player by defending all three titles he won in 2023. He overcame immense pressure as the targeted defending champion to win the singles final against Indonesia's Bima Abdi Negara.

Koen Pang became the first Singaporean male since 2007 to win both the Men's and Mixed Doubles at a single Games. He partnered with Izaak Quek for the Men's title and Zeng Jian to reclaim the Mixed Doubles crown from Malaysia.

The men's team successfully defended their title in a grueling 3–2 final against Vietnam. The victory was particularly

hard-fought as the team dealt with injuries, including a high ankle sprain for Josh Chua during the final. Despite the injury, Josh fought hard with a heavily taped ankle.

The women's team came "agonisingly close" to their first team gold since 2017. In a dramatic final against host nation Thailand, they led 2–1 but eventually fell 2–3. Lin Qian put up a valiant effort, taking Thai veteran Suthasini Sawettabut to five sets in the deciding match.

At the 2026 Singapore Smash (19 February – 1 March 2026), local teenage wildcards Loy Ming Ying (15) and Chloe Lai (19) made history as the first Singaporean pair to reach the Women's Doubles Quarter-Finals.

They secured a landmark victory against the higher-ranked Australian-German pairing of **Yangzi Liu** (World No. 36) and **Yuan Wan** (World No. 72) in the quarter-finals with a score of 3-2 (4-11, 11-8, 4-11, 11-9, 11-3).

In the singles category, Chloe Lai also showed significant improvement, recording her first-ever match wins at a Singapore Smash after three previous early exits. In Qualifying Round 1, she defeated Brianna Burgos (PUR) with a scoreline of 3-2 (8-11, 11-8, 11-7, 7-11, 11-9). In Qualifying Round 2, she staged a dramatic comeback against Su Tsz Tung (HKG), winning 3-2 after being two games down and saving a match point (3-11, 11-13, 11-6, 11-8, 12-10).

At the 29th Asian Youth Table Tennis Championships 2025 held in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, Team Singapore delivered a historic performance led by the Under-15 Girls' Team, who clinched a joint-bronze medal. This achievement marked Singapore's first U15 team medal at the Asian Youth level since 2019.

5.0 SPORTS DEVELOPMENT

5.1 Learn-To-Play (Basic) and Continue-To-Play (Intermediate) Programmes

The Learn-to-Play (LTP) Programme was established to introduce individuals aged 5 and above to the sport of table tennis in a fun, structured, and inclusive environment. Specially designed for beginners, the programme provides participants with a strong foundation by teaching the fundamental rules, essential skills, and basic techniques of the game, while fostering interest, confidence, and enjoyment in the sport.

Upon completing the 10-lesson Learn-to-Play (LTP) Programme, participants are encouraged to continue their development through the Continue-to-Play (CTP) Programme. Designed as the next stage of progression, the CTP Programme provides a more advanced level of training for participants who wish to further enhance their techniques, build greater consistency, and deepen their understanding of the sport.

As of FY2025, the LTP Programme is conducted at six training centres across Singapore:

- Clementi
- Hougang
- Yishun
- Bishan
- Kallang
- Pasir Ris

In FY2025, STTA successfully organised 25 LTP classes, attracting over 216 participants and reflecting strong community interest and growing participation in the sport.

5.2 Zone Training Centres

The main objective of the Zone Training Centres (ZTC) Programme is to identify, nurture, and develop local table tennis talent from a young age. As a key component of Singapore Table Tennis Association's talent development pathway, the programme provides promising young players with structured training and development opportunities to help them realise their potential.

Through a systematic selection process and performance-based trials, outstanding players are identified and given the opportunity to progress to the Junior Development Squad (JDS), an important milestone within STTA's structured high-performance pathway aimed at developing future national athletes.

As of 31 March 2026, the ZTC Programme had a total of 321 players, with an average of 54 players per centre. The majority of participants were between 5 and 11 years old, with some continuing in the programme up to the age of 13.

To cultivate a strong competitive spirit and provide players with valuable exposure to tournament play, coaches regularly encourage and support trainees to participate in annual competitions organised or co-organised by Singapore Table Tennis Association. Such opportunities allow players to gain important match experience, apply their skills in a competitive setting, and reinforce the techniques and strategies learned during training.

Trainees from the Zone Training Centres (ZTC) Programme have consistently delivered commendable performances in local competitions, particularly in the Under-9 category, where a significant number of players progressing to the Round of 16 and beyond are ZTC trainees. These achievements reflect the effectiveness of the programme in identifying and nurturing young talent.

The ZTC Programme continues to serve as a key feeder into the Junior Development Squad (JDS), playing a important role in Singapore Table Tennis Association's long-term athlete development framework and nurturing the next generation of table tennis talents and future champions in Singapore.

5.3 Coaching Accreditation and Development System

STTA successfully organised the Sixth run of the SG-Coach Level 1 (Full Integration) Table Tennis Coaching Course from 14 November to 12 December 2025. This course incorporated E-Learning modules hosted on the SportSG-ED platform by CoachSG, ensuring a blended and flexible learning experience for aspiring coaches. In addition, the theory assessments for Foundation Sports Science and Coaching Theory were conducted at OCBC Arena. A total of 20 participants attended and completed the course.

To further support the professional growth of certified coaches, STTA also conducted three Continuing Coach Education (CCE) Workshops on 29 Apr, 18 Aug, 27 Oct 2025, and 4 Feb 2026 which drew a combined total of 127 participants. These workshops aimed to keep coaches updated on the latest methodologies and best practices in coaching.

In conjunction with the WTT Smash Singapore 2026, STTA also hosted a special coaching seminar

featuring the world-renowned Chinese national coach Sun Xun. Coach Sun shared valuable insights and experiences with our developmental coaches, providing a rare opportunity for local coaches to learn from one of the sport's leading minds. The seminar was well received, with 73 coaches in attendance.



5.4 Sports Development

5.4.1 Table Tennis School Holiday Camp

The Table Tennis School Holiday Camp is an outreach initiative aimed at introducing young students to the sport of table tennis in a fun, engaging, and supportive environment. Conducted over two half-day sessions, the camp focuses on developing fundamental skills such as grip, footwork, coordination, and ball control through interactive drills, activities, and game-based learning.

Beyond skill development, the programme seeks to cultivate interest, enjoyment, and confidence in the sport by providing participants with a positive and enriching first experience of table tennis. Students who demonstrate enthusiasm, aptitude, and potential may subsequently be guided towards further development opportunities within Singapore Table Tennis Association's player development pathway, including the Zone Training Centres (ZTC) Programme, as well as the Learn-to-Play (LTP) and Continue-to-Play (CTP) programmes.

In FY2025, STTA successfully organised a total of Six School Holiday Camps:

- June Holiday Camp 1 (2–3 June 2025)
- June Holiday Camp 2 (26–27 June 2025)
- September Holiday Camp (11–12 September 2025)
- November Holiday Camp (27–28 November 2025)
- December Holiday Camp (1–2 December 2025)
- March Holiday Camp (17&19 March 2026)

These camps attracted a total of 132 students, with participants aged between 5 and 12 years. The positive response highlights growing interest in the sport and underscores the camp's value as an effective engagement platform.



6.1 Locally Organised Tournaments

In FY2025, STTA continued to organise and collaborate with partners to co-organise numerous local competitions, creating a vibrant competition calendar catering to players across different age groups and skill levels. In addition to the regular ranking tournaments, where local players accumulated national ranking points towards qualification for the Char Yong National Youth Top 10 Table Tennis Tournament, STTA also introduced team competitions and community challenges to encourage broader participation. Key highlights of the year included the SG60-themed STTA 60-for-60 Team Challenge, the expanded Masters Series across multiple constituencies, and the Singapore Junior & Hopes Invitational, which attracted participants from nine countries.

Held in conjunction with SG60 celebrations, the STTA 60-for-60 Team Challenge brought together 70 teams in a team-based format that promoted camaraderie, healthy competition, and active participation across different player groups. The event fostered strong community engagement and a vibrant spirit of teamwork within the table tennis community.

In addition, STTA partnered with the Singapore Sports School to organise the 7th Singapore Junior & Hopes Invitational from 3 to 7 June 2025. The competition featured four age categories (Under-10, Under-12, Under-15, and Under-19) across 16 events, attracting 277 entries from seven countries, including Australia, China, Chinese Taipei, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Singapore.

7.0 OFFICIATING

7.1 Umpires / Referees

In FY2025, STTA continued to strengthen the capabilities of its technical officials through a series of structured development initiatives and training programmes.

During the year, STTA organised a National Umpire Course from 22 September to 6 October 2025. A total of 18 participants registered for and attended the course, contributing to the continued renewal and growth of our officiating pool.

Separately, a Referees' Seminar was held on 9 Nov 2025 to provide important updates, learning points, and reinforce standards and expectations among Singapore's referees.

The Umpires' Seminar, held on 20 Dec 2025, saw the participation of over 56 umpires. The seminar included:

- A presentation on completed projects in FY2025
- Latest updates on officiating guidelines and international best practices
- A knowledge quiz to reinforce learning, with prizes awarded to top scorers

STTA also provided international exposure opportunities by sending qualified referees and umpires to officiate at major overseas events, including:

- 34th Asian Cup 2025
- SEA Youth Championships at Jakarta
- ITTF World Table Tennis Championship at Doha
- Asian Games and Asian Paralympic Games
- 33rd SEA Games at Bangkok
- WTT SMASH / Champions / Finals / Youth Contender / Feeders

Locally, STTA's international umpires played key officiating roles in prestigious events such as the WTT Singapore Smash and the Youth Star Contender, held at the OCBC Arena from 19 Feb to 1 Mar 2026.

8.2 Crocodile Challenge Cup Finals

The finals of the Crocodile Challenge Cup on 1 June 2025 were graced by Mr David Neo, Acting Minister for Culture, Community and Youth & Senior Minister of State for Education, who attended as Guest of Honour.



This year's tournament, which kicked off on 26 May 2025, saw an impressive 396 participants from a record 91 primary schools across the island, reflecting the growing popularity of the sport and the depth of emerging young talent in Singapore's table tennis scene.

He enjoyed an exhilarating Primary 5 and 6 Boys' Singles final and later joined in a lively mini doubles match alongside the winners of the Primary 3 and 4 category.

In the Primary 5 and 6 Singles events, Neo Cheng Ming of Kong Hwa School clinched the Boys' title, while Gu Xintian of Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School emerged victorious in the Girls' category. Both winners will be rewarded with a fully sponsored trip to represent Singapore at an upcoming World Table Tennis (WTT) Youth competition overseas—an exciting next step in their sporting journey.

Minister Neo also presented awards to the tournament's top performers and offered words of encouragement to the young athletes, their families, coaches, and teachers, applauding their dedication and sporting spirit

8.3 STTA Fundraising Golf and Dinner

The day teed off with a friendly golf tournament in the afternoon, which saw 100 golfers take to the course, giving their all under the hot sun. 13.0 CHARITY STATUS

STTA had been registered as a charity under the Charities Act since 1 January 2011. Following its registration, income received by the Association is exempted from tax, in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act applicable to registered charities.

14.0 GST REGISTRATION

STTA had been registered for Goods and Services Tax (GST) since 1 March 2000. As a GST-registered entity, STTA is required to comply with GST regulations, including charging GST on taxable supplies and filing periodic GST returns to the Inland Revenue Authority of Singapore (IRAS).

15.0 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS & RESERVES

STTA had established a reserves policy to ensure the long-term financial stability of its operations and to maintain sufficient resources in the event of unforeseen circumstances.

The Association aims to maintain reserves equivalent to at least one year of operational expenditure. This reserve level is reviewed annually by the Management Committee to ensure it remains adequate to meet the Association's ongoing obligations and to support its mission sustainably.

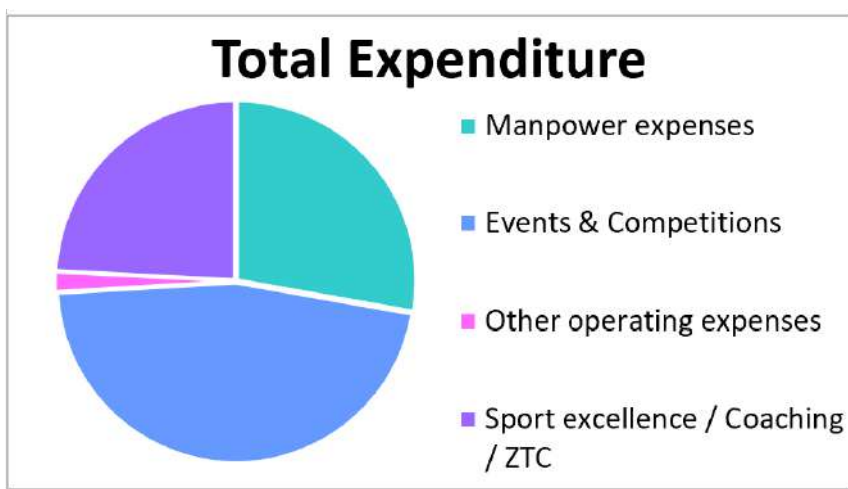
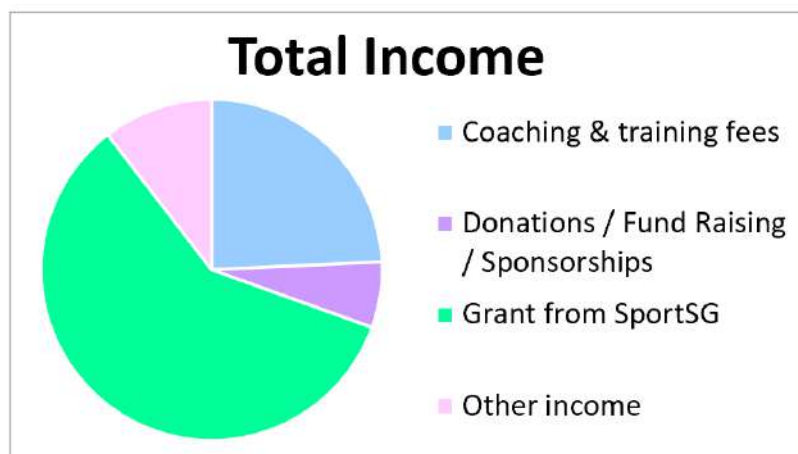

20.0 FUTURE PLANS AND COMMITMENTS

20.1 High Performance

The 2026 calendar represents a critical peak for Singapore's high-performance table tennis programme. Following the strategic review of the 2025 SEA Games—where Singapore retained the Men's Team Gold and secured Women's Team Silver—the STTA is focused on two major multi-sport goals: the 20th Asian Games and the Youth Olympic Games.



The Bronze medal in the Asian Championships Women's team event in 2025 showed that team Singapore is able to compete with the best in Asia. The partnership between Izaak Quek and Koen Pang has reached an elite global level. As of February 2026, the duo achieved a career-high World No. 4 ranking in Men's Doubles. STTA's strategy focuses on maintaining this momentum to secure podium finishes in Nagoya.

The 2026 Youth Olympic Games in Dakar, Senegal (31 October – 13 November 2026) is a cornerstone of the STTA's long-term development pathway. Loy Ming Ying has taken one year leave of absence from school to prepare for YOG.

Other major events in 2026 include the World Team Table Tennis Championships and Asian Championships.

Besides the Championships and major games, the World Table Tennis (WTT) calendar remains packed, featuring a full slate of competitions including:

- WTT Smashes
- WTT Championships
- WTT Contender Series
- WTT Feeder Series

Beyond international tournaments, foreign leagues and sparring opportunities are critical success factors for the new Olympic cycle. In FY2025, STTA has signed an MOU with Yuchi Training Base in Tianjin which will allow our players to play in China Leagues. STTA will continue to actively pursue partnerships with clubs and national associations to secure overseas training stints and foreign league exposure for our athletes, enhancing their competitiveness on the global stage.

20.2 Sports Development

a) Coaching Development

STTA remains steadfast in its commitment to advancing the development of table tennis coaches in Singapore. Since the introduction of the Technical Accreditation Policy in February 2019, experienced coaches have been provided with a structured and progressive pathway to attain technical certification. Moving forward, this framework will continue to be enhanced to support the evolving needs of the coaching community and the sport.

As part of this commitment, STTA will continue to conduct the Full Integration Level 1 Coaching Course while actively developing the syllabus for the Level 2 Coaching Course. These initiatives are aimed at

elevating coaching standards, strengthening technical competencies, and ensuring alignment with international best practices in coach education.

In addition, STTA will continue to organise:

- Coaching Workshops
- Continuing Coach Education (CCE) Courses

These programmes are designed to provide coaches with ongoing opportunities to upgrade their skills, expand their knowledge, and stay current with modern coaching methodologies.

To further support the professional growth of coaches, STTA will also facilitate coaching attachments and mentorship programmes. These initiatives will encourage meaningful exchanges of expertise, foster knowledge transfer, and strengthen collaboration between local and international coaching communities, ultimately contributing to the long-term development of table tennis in Singapore.

b) Technical and Officiating Development

Singapore Table Tennis Association will continue to place strong emphasis on the development of local technical officials, recognising the vital role they play in upholding the integrity, professionalism, and high standards of the sport.

To support this vision, the development and progression pathways for umpires and referees have been reviewed and enhanced in alignment with International Table Tennis Federation standards. This ensures that local officials are well-equipped with the knowledge, competencies, and practical experience required to meet international expectations. STTA remains committed to creating opportunities for aspiring officials to advance onto the international stage through targeted training, greater exposure, and hands-on officiating experiences at various levels of competition.

In line with these efforts, the Umpires and Referees Committee will introduce a structured umpire evaluation and assessment framework. This initiative is designed to strengthen the competency, consistency, and professionalism of local technical officials, while providing a clear pathway for progression towards higher-level appointments and international certification opportunities.

c) Local Tournaments and Events

Singapore Table Tennis Association remains strongly committed to the development and growth of table tennis in Singapore by nurturing a broad and sustainable base of players at all levels. Through continuous engagement and development initiatives, STTA aims to strengthen participation, inspire sporting excellence, and contribute to a vibrant and inclusive sporting culture within the community.

As part of this commitment, STTA has planned a series of local tournaments and events for FY2026 that are designed to engage the wider community, provide competitive opportunities for players, support talent development, and further elevate the profile of table tennis in Singapore:

20.3 Fundraising, Donations and Sponsorships

The Association successfully organised a Golf & Dinner Fund-Raising Event on 24 July 2025. In line with our fund-raising strategy, such events are planned on a biennial basis. This approach ensures the

sustainable use of the Association's limited resources, as each fund-raising event requires significant planning, manpower, and volunteer commitment.

In the current economic environment, organising fund-raising activities too frequently may lead to donor fatigue, reduce participation and contributions from supporters, and place additional demands on volunteers and organisational resources. Maintaining appropriate intervals between fund-raising campaigns helps preserve their effectiveness, maximise stakeholder engagement, and demonstrate prudent stewardship of funds entrusted to the Association.

As such, no major fund-raising event is planned for the next financial year. The Association will continue to monitor its funding requirements and review future fund-raising needs accordingly.

Notwithstanding this, we remain committed to nurturing future generations of elite athletes and strengthening Singapore's presence in international table tennis. We will continue to work closely with our regular donors and sponsors while actively engaging new supporters who share our vision and commitment to the sport.

We also welcome contributions through our Giving.sg donation platform, which provides an avenue for individuals and organisations to support our programmes and initiatives.

Together with our donors, supporters, and sponsors, we will continue to rally behind Team Singapore and build a strong foundation for sustained excellence and future success in table tennis.

20.4 Planned Expenditure for the Following Year

STTA's expenditure plans for the following year include:

- Pathway Development for Team Singapore athletes
- High Performance Sports System to develop Team Singapore Athletes and enhance the training / competition environment for them locally and overseas.
- Pre-Asian Games & Pre-Youth Olympics preparation, training and competition;
- Governance / Administrative / Overheads

20.5 Administration

Following its temporary relocation from its long-time premises in Toa Payoh to the OCBC Arena at the Singapore Sports Hub in October 2023, STTA has continued to deliver its training programmes, athlete development initiatives, and operational activities without disruption. The interim facility provides a conducive environment for the Association to maintain high-performance training standards while preparing for its future permanent home.

Looking ahead, STTA is scheduled to return to Toa Payoh as part of the upcoming Integrated Development, a landmark project that will bring together a sports centre, polyclinic, public library, and National Training Centres for various sports, including table tennis. Expected to be completed by 2030, the development will provide STTA with a modern, purpose-built facility designed to meet the evolving needs of athletes, coaches, and the wider table tennis community.

The new National Training Centre will strengthen STTA's ability to nurture future generations of athletes, enhance high-performance programmes, and support Singapore's continued

competitiveness on the international stage. Until then, STTA remains committed to maximising the opportunities available at its current location while laying the groundwork for a smooth transition to its future home in Toa Payoh.

The Association looks forward to this significant milestone, which will provide a strong foundation for the continued growth and development of table tennis in Singapore for many years to come.
